#### Program

Chandler Mayor Jay Tibshraeny joined us to present a State of the City message. He was introduced by Jim Patmos. A native of Chandler, Jay served eight years in the Arizona State Senate, has been Chandler mayor twice and is in his seventh term. He also is current President of the League of Arizona Cities, which includes all cities and towns in the state. He is being term-limited out so he announced he plans to run for Justice of the Peace.

He told us Chandler has applied to be a second American headquarters for Amazon. He noted location in the East Valley would benefit Chandler even if they didn't locate here.

The mayor talked about downtown construction, including the new apartments going up at San Marcos, and the new FLIX theater, which will be upscale with food service and comfort seating. He cited a new parking garage that went up in one day.

He said when he was a kid, Chandler was a city of 6-7,000. Now it is 253,000 and likely won't become much larger. "There's not a lot of ground left," he said, "although we could possibly reach as high as 280,000."

He noted the many fall activities in Chandler. "No one wants to do anything in July or August," he said.

they affect cities as well as the state. He said Chandler remains strong and continues to receive AAA ratings on bonds. He is helping work on the budget. He also continues to mentor new council members.

The mayor said the city will continue to develop and improve streets, also noting that Chandler continues to rate near the lowest in rates for services. He said the city is trying to slow down apartment building and they are dealing with storage problems.

He noted more resources that are becoming available in "uptown" Chandler. He said the council will "keep the options open" on light rail for the city.
