Program

Edward Myers III, President of the Valley of the Sun chapter of the Little People of America, told us about that organization. He was introduced by Ron Stevens.

Ed has practiced disability law for 25 years. He worked as a law clerk for the Montana Supreme Court, has been an adjunct professor at NAU and recently retired as Deputy Executive Director for the Arizona Center for Disability Law.

The Valley of the Sun chapter includes Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Utah and parts of Texas. There are 350 families in the Valley of the Sun chapter. There are about 1,350 chapters around the country. October was Little People Awareness Month.

Little People of America was started in the fifties by actor Billy Barty. Originally it was called Midgets of America, but the term midget is considered derogatory so the name was changed.

Dwarfism is a correct medical term. Ed said it is OK to use dwarfism, but they prefer little people. He told a story about "midget wrestling" in Chandler and all he and the organization went through to stymie that, and similar events.
