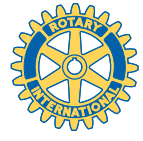

Program

Michelle MacLennan, director of the Chandler Center for the Arts, brought us up-to-date on that facility. She was introduced by Jim Patmos. Michelle has been with the CCA since 1999 and has been chair of the Chandler Cultural Foundation since 2014.

The CCA opened in August, 1989 and is in its 28th season. It holds more than 1,000 events per year, serving more than 300,000 people. It is ranked as one of the top venues in Arizona.

It can seat 1,500 people in the main auditorium. However, two smaller venues can seat 350 and 200 people, respectively. Special events also are held in the grand foyer. It was built for \$10 million. The Tempe Center for the Arts was built 10 years ago for \$97 million.

The CCA is operated by the Chandler Education Foundation, with Chandler High school using the facility Monday through Thursday and the Chandler Cultural Foundation using it Friday through Sunday.

The Chandler Arts Association maintains the facility and hires the staff. The Chandler Unified School District shares in the cost. The CCA has an annual budget of \$1.8 billion. The city's share is \$1.6 billion.

The CCA provides low cost or no cost art events. There are 5,400 students who are involved and 20,000 patrons attend events, some of which are free. The Chandler Symphony Orchestra is one *Please continue reading on page 2*

The CCA also operates the Vision Gallery, which is located on the first floor of City Hall. There are many public art projects. And they are working on documentaries. They have a class 5 liquor license for performances.

They are in the midst of a 10-year capital investment program that will include new wallpaper and LED lighting. Current renovations include remodeling the rest rooms. They also are conducting a market research study and they have a marketing plan.

They conduct 30 presented and 175 non-profit events per year. They turn away 5-7 events per week.

They have a voucher program. Michelle presented vouchers to Ron Stevens and Doug Hawkins for questions they asked. They have 130 active volunteers but always can use more.
