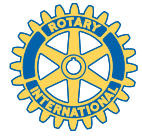

Our Adopt-a-Family project has been completed for 2017. Presents were delivered by Santa Claus to the Gausto and Sharon Quintero family on December 10. Presents for the Walters family were delivered Christmas morning.

Stephanie Walters lost her husband of 20 years October 28 when he suffered a severe stroke that left him with multiple complicated brain injuries. He fell into a coma and the decision was made by his family to remove him from life support. He passed less than 24 hours later. Stefanie was left to care for their five children: Scott, 23, who is currently stationed with the U.S. Army in Washington, D.C., Chris, 19, Sky 18, Michael, 14, and Riley, 11 (see photo above).

All except Scott live at home and are in school. Since Jason's death Stephanie has gained employment but the suddenness of his death caught the family off guard. Chandler Horizon Rotary has stepped up to provide a Fry's gift card and gifts including clothes and a few items for the two younger kids. Thanks to all those who participated.
