Terry Locke, Doug Hawkins Give Their Classification Talks

Terry Locke, Director of Community Relations for the Chandler Unified School District, noted that in 1997 Chandler High was the only high school in CUSD. Hamilton opened in 1998 and other high schools have been added since then.

Terry called it an evolution necessitated by a shift in population. CUSD now has nearly 45,000 students. Chandler was recently named the second highest school in the country in achievement growth during a five-year period.

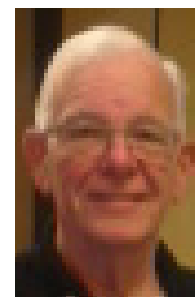
There is diversity among schools, including neighborhood, traditional and more structured. CUSD also has schools with a gifted program that includes gifted teachers. Students at Perry High School can major in the STEM program. In some schools, STEM begins in kindergarten.

Terry was graduated from Cal State East Bay

in Heyward. He left California just before the earthquake that interrupted the World Series in San Francisco in 1989.

His wife, Ellen, works for Robson. They have two children whom Terry says are as different as night and day. They both attended Anderson Jr. High and graduated from Chandler High. Dustin is a math teacher at Williamsfield High School and Reagan attends ASU. Terry lists cooking, dining and sports as his hobbies.

Doug Hawkins grew up in Klamath Falls, Oregon, and eventually moved to California. After stints in the Peace Corps and U.S. Army,

he became an instructor and eventually Associate Dean at Golden Gate University in San Francisco.

He ultimately moved to Arizona where he became involved in the real estate business and he became an Associate Dean at Grand Canyon University. His wife, DeeAnne, was involved in probate cases, so they teamed up to work in real estate together.

Doug was a member of the North Phoenix Rotary Club from 1991-1999, and was District Chairman for RYLA. When he and DeeAnne moved to Sun Lakes, he dropped out of Rotary until he joined Chandler Horizon in 2016. DeeAnne recently became a member of the Sun Lakes Rotary Club.

Doug was raised on a ranch so he has had a lifelong love of horses. He was involved in cattle drives when he was younger. He spent time in the Peace Corps and then, as he says, "President Lyndon Johnson invited me to join the Army and serve in Vietnam."

He and DeeAnne have a summer home in Pine. They have two children and three grandchildren. Doug has traveled to 28 countries. In addition to travel he lists salt water aquariums and sailing as his hobbies.
