Program

Detective Jeff Jacobs from the Mesa Police Department addressed the subject: "Situation Awareness and Active Violence." He was introduced by Marty Herder. Det. Jacobs has been with the Mesa P.D. for 27 years where he is the lead firearms instructor. He also served on an FBI Task Force for three years.

He talked about motivation, noting that personal security is, in fact, personal. Everyone needs to make a personal commitment to survive, no matter what.

Situational Awareness means being aware of what is happening around you. His recipe for success: Awareness - Recognition - Action (ARA).

He talked about active violence which includes preparation and planning: mental, physical and emotional. Everyone is obligated to be aware.

He discussed the "cell phone epidemic" at length. We all knew to what he was referring because we all have been guilty of being so engrossed in our cell phones we have no clue what is going on around us. He calls it "being buried in our device."

Houston Project

EDITOR'S NOTE: Doug Gardner sent in the following report this past Sunday on the progress of the CHRC team working on the rebuilding project in Houston.

I wanted to give you a report on the progress here in Houston. Jerry Turner and I arrived safely in Houston on Saturday, January 13 after a twoday drive from Phoenix with our trailer load of tools. On Sunday we connected with John Rudd, took a survey of the house and began preparation to begin work on Monday, the 15th.

The sheetrock was not as complete as anticipated, but that turned out to be a good thing. We found electrical work in the kitchen and family room that needed to be changed and installed before sheetrock.

On Monday, the 15th, we had Roger Morsch, James Caskey, Jerry Turner, John Rudd and myself onsite and we made good progress. Then a cold and ice storm hit Monday evening with temperatures dropping into the teens and near 10 degrees with the wind chill. The local authorities requested that all citizens stay off the roads on Tuesday, so we were not able to work that day.

On Wednesday, after the icy roads began to melt, we were able to get to the jobsite and make some progress. It remained cold most of the week so we have had some hard luck with the weather, but we continue to move forward as temperatures return to more normal levels.

At this point, I believe we have purchased the majority of the materials and it appears we will have sufficient funds to complete the job. If you have ever remodeled a house, you know there are always surprises and unanticipated issues and we have had some of those, but nothing real expensive.

He also related a personal experience involving Det. Jones, his wife, and another couple in a parking lot. He talked about denial and distraction with denial involving a lack of expectation.

Det. Jones noted his presentation usually lasts four hours, but he condensed it into 40 minutes. He was asked it he makes the presentation in schools, but he said he has trouble getting into schools because school officials are afraid "it might happen here."

It was one of our more memorable, enlightening and informative programs of the year.
