Tim Schauermann Presents Program on Amazon: The World's Biggest River

Tim Schauermann presented a program on "Amazon: The Biggest River in the World." It was based on a trip that he and Nancy took there last fall.

The cruise started in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, went through the eastern Caribbean islands and on to South America. It was a moderate sized cruise ship, about 900 feet tall and 800 feet long.

He told us a little about the history of the Caribbean islands, which were colonized by European countries, but those people didn't want to work in the excessive heat, nor did the natives. So slaves were brought over from Africa who harvested the principal crop, sugar cane, along with other crops that were conducive to the climate. Those African natives are still there today.

The Caribbean islands have all kinds of governments. Most of them have to have a navy to avoid being attacked by other nations. The only country that is linked to the United States is St. Johns. Their guide from St. Johns was a U.S. citizen, but he couldn't vote for the president, vice-president, or members of Congress.

Tim told us that 100,000 years ago the Amazon used to flow into the Pacific, but the plates shifted, the Andes pushed up and the flow changed toward the east and the Atlantic.

He showed us an over-lapping photo indicating that the Amazon basin is nearly as large as the United States. Tim said it rains everywhere virtually all the time.

The mouth of the Amazon is 50 miles wide and the sand bar extends 300 miles into the Atlantic Ocean. There are no bridges nor any dams across the Amazon. The river is crossed by ferry boats of varying sizes, Some are painted yellow. They are school buses.

The land for the first 200 miles up the Amazon

is very flat and all jungle. There are no villages, no railroads, no cars. People get in or out by either boat or plane.

The largest city is Maneus, which has a population of two million and is 500 miles in. It was built with rubber money. The Amazon basin is the only place rubber trees grow naturally. Henry Ford built a rubber plantation, but eventually Indonesians moved in, took over and moved the rubber plant to Indonesia. Eventually the entire rubber business died out when it was replaced by synthtetic rubber.

The people of Maneus were of European culture and used the rubber money to build a magnificent opera house. Built in 1905, the opera house still stands, but today it is more of a tourist attraction.


