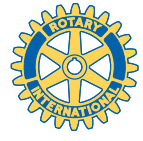

Board Meeting

The Board of Directors held its regular monthly meeting Tuesday.

The board recommended a \$1,000 donation to Devils Doing Good for their support in marketing of our Hole-in-One Contest. Jennifer Bertoldo indicated they will donate the money to a family in California that lost their home during the recent wildfires there.

The Hole-in-One Contest was discussed at length. Concern was expressed about a decrease in sponsors this year, which may necessitate a decrease in the amount of funds we give back to the community. Our only savior now appears to be a large increase in the number of shooters. Members are reminded to pass out the shooter cards and recruit more new shooters to participate in our event.

It was agreed that we should get an earlier start on our sponsor search for next year, perhaps shortly after this year's event has been completed. The board also agreed that more club members need to become more involved in more activities of the Hole-in-One Contest.

The board recommended that any recipient check not cashed within 90-120 days of our Thank You Breakfast be voided.

There was discussion on the new Lee Barnes Tree at San Marcos. More details will be made available at today's club meeting.
