Program

Peter Kyle, Chairman of the Rotary Peace Centers Committee for the past three years, brought us up-to-date on the Peace Centers. He was introduced by Jim Patmos.



A native of New Zealand, Peter was awarded an Ambassadorial Scholarship during which he completed his Master of Laws degree at the University of Virginia in 1974. He was inducted into the Wellington North Rotary Club in 1976 and currently is a member of The Capitol Hill club in Washington, D.C.

Peter has served as District Governor as well as on many Rotary International and Rotary Foundation committees. He was awarded The Rotary Foundation Global Alumni Service Award to Humanity and received the Citation for Meritorious Service in 2015.

Peter reminded us that eradication of polio is the No. 1 focus of Rotary. The Peace Centers are No. 2.

He gave a brief history of Rotary's involvement with peace, starting with a proposal in Minneapolis early in Rotary's history. After World War I peace was a major focus of Rotary. When World War II came along, the focus shifted somewhat to be more on human rights.

Rotary was instrumental in founding of the United Nations and is one of only two organizations that has had a close association with the UN. The other is the Red Cross. Shortly thereafter the Ambassadorial Scholarship program was started.

Peter noted the fifties, sixties and seventies were a time of the cold war. In 2002, The Rotary Foundation took a new direction with the establishment of the Rotary Peace Centers at six universities around the world. Peter listed the qualifications for Peace Center programs as well as their benefits.

One hundred scholarships are awarded each year: 50 for the Master's Degree program which is one year; and 50 for the Certificate program
