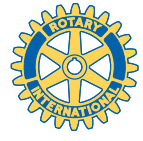

### Board Meeting Postponed

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors has been postponed. It has been rescheduled for Tuesday, March 13, at 6:50 a.m. in the office of President Theresa Clemmons.

### Program

Dena Kidd, Senior Director of Development and Stewardship for Junior Achievement, brought us up-to-date on that organization.

Dena told us that JA was founded by three people in Boston in 1919 and will soon celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It was founded on principles similar to 4H. JA recently celebrated 60 years in Arizona, having started in Tucson in 1957. Chandler Horizon Rotary has been a supporter of JA since 1994, the first year of our Hole-in-One Contest. She passed out letters of thanks from JA students.

There are 80,000 JA students in 23 programs and 3,100 classrooms in Arizona. Fifty-nine percent of them are from lower income families. JA has a staff of 35 and 9,000 volunteers.

Junior Achievement has classroom programs for grades K-12. "All lessons are stepping stone," Dena said. At the kindergarten level, students begin concepts of income and economics, and are given paper banks in which they can save money.

Middle grade students become more advanced. JA has added a STEM program. At the high school level, students display their knowledge and skills for economic success.

Dena related stories of students. Studies have shown that JA students are 20 percent more likely to earn a Bachelor's degree.

She told us about JA programs, including JA Biztown where students develop an entire city with businesses, etc. JA Finance Park (grades 7-12) is more like real life where students work in teams and create a family scenario.

JA You're Hired is a day for high school students to learn about the hiring process. Cyber security was added to the program this year. Stock Market Challenge, which takes place in November, *Please continue reading on page 2*

### Hole-in-One Contest

Two weekends down and one more to go in our 25<sup>th</sup> annual Hole-in-One Contest. There apparently was some wind left over from the previous Monday, because we had to deal with wind again on Friday, although not quite so severe.

Saturday and Sunday were cool, but cloudless, and the shooters turned out. We had good totals each today and are in seventh place overall for the 25 years.

We had no holes-in-one the first weekend, but five this past weekend. Last year we had three overall. We have had 97 semifinal qualifying shots in six days. Last year we had 100 for the entire event.

The Silent Auction continues to draw interest. There still are many sui generis items available. The 50-50 drawing is reaching \$500 and could double on the final weekend.

Don't forget to hand out shooter cards, get your friends to come, hit balls, contribute to the 50-50 drawing and check out the Silent Auction items. Although there is no qualifying on Sunday, the Silent Auction and 50-50 will continue right up to the finals. It should be a fun weekend.

Qualifying continues this Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. The semifinals will start at 1 p.m. Sunday, followed by the \$20,000 Women's Shootout and the overall \$100,000 finals at approximately 2:30 p.m. Remember, if no one gets a hole-in-one in the finals, the closest to the pin will receive \$5,000, with the runner-up pocketing \$2,500; \$1,000 will go to the third place finisher.

It's not too late to obtain Ring of Honor sponsors. For \$50, those sponsors who maybe couldn't go for the \$250 tee box, can get their name on the big board for the final weekend. The absolute deadline for Ring of Honor sponsors is 10 a.m. Friday. Get the info to Jim Hoenig prior to that and he'll get 'er done.
