### **Hole-in-One Contest**

Blessed with good weather throughout most of the event, the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club's 25<sup>th</sup> annual Hole-in-One Contest came to a close Sunday with Joe Yanes from Chandler crowned champion. He didn't get a hole-in-one to win \$100,000, but his shot was 5'8<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from the 155-yard pin and he won the first alternate prize of \$5,000.

Jerry Farrer from Phoenix finished second at 7'9" and he earned \$2,500. Our own Jerry Turner was third at 15'41/2" and he pocketed \$1,000. Both Jerrys had holes-in-one in qualifying.

Joe Yanes was one of nine golfers who qualified from the semifinals into the overall finals. We had 155 semifinal qualifiers over eight days and 20 shooters in the finals. We had 10 shots in the Women's Shootout.

Melissa Bomar put her tee shot 13'5" from the 135-yard pin to win the \$20,000 Women's Shootout and earn \$500. After 25 years, we still are looking for our first hole-in-one of any kind in the finals.

President Theresa Clemmons won the 50-50 pot which grew to \$1,146 by Sunday. She will collect \$573. A second prize was added to the 50-50 drawing. Iggy Calalang won a \$100 gift certificate to Bitzee Mama's, a Mexican restaurant in Glendale.

The 50-50 drawing was higher than ever by quite a bit. And the Silent Auction, which was much more extensive this year, should bring in some good numbers. That should help offset the fact we were quite a bit short on sponsor money this year.

That and the fact we had a good turnout of shooters, despite one windy day and another that was quite breezy. Preliminary reports indicate we are in fifth place overall for the 25 years in terms of shooter money raised.

We had 236 shooters this year, compared with 177 in 2017 when we had one less day of qualifying. The 236 included 145 new shooters. We had 32 female shooters this year, 19 of them new. We thank all of our shooters for their participation.
