Board Meeting

The Board of Directors held its regular monthly meeting Tuesday.

The board reviewed the club financials and discussed the problem of members who are delinquent in their dues payments as well as the problem of members who have paid their dues but basically never attend our weekly meetings or work on projects. The board agreed to move forward with plans to rectify these problems.

The board heard a financial report on our 25th annual Hole-in-One Contest. There still is some money to come in both in sponsorships and payment for Silent Auction items. But there are also some expenses that have not been paid. It is estimated that we will be somewhere around \$5,000 short of last year, which was a down year.

A joint meeting of the club and Foundation boards will be scheduled soon to determine which organizations will receive funds and how much. Board members agreed some cuts will have to be made, both in terms of recipient organizations and the amounts that will be given to each. village about 30 miles from Caborca where they went door-to-door to administer the drops of vaccine. "The kids fought," Tim said, "which is understandable." They were able to vaccinate approximately 150 children.

Back in the compound, the Rotarians enjoyed good food and fellowship with their hosts. Terry showed photos of youngsters suffering from polio. Approximately \$15,000 was raised for the event, including donations from Chandler Horizon club members and the Chandler Horizon Rotary Foundation.
