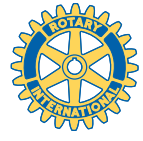

Program

Katie Kahle, Director of the Chandler Care Center, told us about that organization. She was introduced by Terry Locke. Katie grew up in Tempe, and has bachelor's and Master's degrees from ASU.

The Chandler Care Center is part of the Chandler Unified School District and is located near Galveston Elementary School.

CCC operates a food bank year around, serving 375 families per month. Last Thanksgiving they handed out 600 meal packages. They also partner with other food banks and St. Vincent dePaul. They conducted a toy drive last Christmas with the Chandler Fire Department Health and Medical.

They operate the Chandler Children Medical & Dental Clinic, which served 1,100 kids in 2017. All services are free. They provide \$4-\$5 in services for every \$1 they receive in donations. They provide flu shots, and have been able to get eyeglasses free from Target.

Katie noted that Chandler is affluent, but still has pockets where people are in need. They provide classes in positive parenting, and always encourage parents to spend more time with their kids.

Katie said that the Chandler Unified School District is one of the few districts in the state providing these services for all students. CUSD provides the building for the Care Center. The majority of funding for the Care Center comes

from outside sources, including grants. They also now qualify for the Arizona Tax Credit program.

Their budget is a little over \$1 million, with \$250,000 of that coming from grants. They have eight employees, including Katie. They are always looking for volunteers.

To be eligible for the services, a student must live in Chandler or attend a CUSD school and not be insured. Many doctors and dentists volunteer their services.
