supportive," she said. "Kids couldn't provide their address, birth certificate or other information. There were huge gaps in their education. The community and school staff also needed to be educated.

"Students have a right to school; to breakfast and/or lunch; to clothes, backpacks and other school supplies; and to transportation. We receive all sorts of donated clothing and household items. Students are entitled to attend the same school where they were when they became homeless."

FIT collaborates with Gilbert, Tempe and Mesa schools on coordinating transportation routes. About 40-50 kids are involved.

Martha noted most state funding goes directly to education. FIT does receive some grant money. They also work with Fans Across America. She said a student also can receive \$20 for each class in which they earn a C or better. She noted graduation rates
