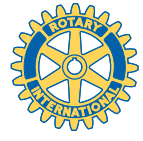

So, even though our shot totals were higher than recent years, the bottom line is we took in about \$4,000 less than 2017, when we had one less qualifying day. Jim also presented statistics from other years that showed our highs for sponsor money and shot income.
