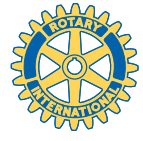

Ellen Lord, Donor Relations and Program Director for the Arizona Foundation for Women, told us about that organization. She was introduced by Kristel Patton.

The Arizona Foundation for Women started in 1995. Its theme is She Counts. The SHE stands for Safety, Advocacy and

Empowerment.

It is neither a political nor a feminist organization. Ellen noted one of four women and one in seven men suffer from intimate violence.

She handed out copies of a book which is produced every two years. It was full of statistics involving women. There were many charts comparing various issues state by state.

AFW recently held its annual banquet where it raises most of its funds. The event, funded by sponsors, raised \$200,000. AFW also receives donations from individuals. More than 750 attended the banquet at which Ashley Judd was named winner of the Sandra Day O'Connor Award.

AFW provides grants to various organizations, such as the Impact 1 Breast Cancer Foundation. They also provide legal help and work with the Girl Scouts.

"It's easier to grant out when we can't provide services ourselves," Ellen said. "We will do anything we can do to help women improve themselves. We are planning a walk in the fall when we will bring in the organizations we support."

There were questions about human trafficking. AFW also works to fight that issue. They worked with the NFL the last time the Super Bowl was played in the Valley. They also sponsor a "Coaching Up" program in high schools.

Ellen reminded us the Arizona Tax Credit can be used for many organizations AFW supports. If you would like more information or would like to donate, contact Ellen at azfw.org.
