Program

Sean O'Neil, CEO and founder of Memory Dynamics, showed us ways we can improve our own memory. He was introduced by Roger Morsch.

He asked members what they most want to improve regarding memory and the overwhelming response was "to remember names." "That's important," Sean said. "If you remember their name, that's a compliment to them. If you can't remember their names, they'll think you don't care or they are not important in your eyes."

Sean said we can remember as much as we want to when we want to. He said all we need to do is train our memory.

He handed out a slip of paper to each member and the group collectively listed 15 items (tree, flower, cup, etc.) by number. We had a few seconds to memorize the list. We turned our papers over and he called on a member to remember as many as he could...in reverse order. He named a few.

Sean said the first and last items are easiest to remember. He also noted how stress can be a factor in memory. He said we should write down whatever information we need to remember. "If you don't write it down," he said, "There is only a 1-in-7 chance you'll remember."

a number or an item, he got them all right. As he went around the room he called each of us by name.

Memory Dynamics offers several workshops throughout the year. He said the classes will accomplish four things: 1) increase your overall recall; 2) he will guarantee you will remember 50 such items [not just the 15 we did]; 3) you will be able to give a presentation without notes; and 4) you will remember names.

Sean offered a discount to club members and their families. He noted you need to continue to work on techniques. Use it or lose it, as it were. He also said class members can come back any time free of charge for a refresher course.
