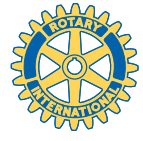

Program

Tim Gibson presented a program on his and Susan's recent trip to Peru. Tim called the 10-day trip, "a nice vacation."

They spent most of the time in the southern part of the country. Peru is on the west coast of South America, and shares boundaries with Ecuador, Colombia, Brazil, Bolivia and Chile.

They visited Juno and Lake Titicaca. He showed houses on Lake Titicaca that were built of reeds. He also showed views of the boats and small islands that were inhabited by natives like homes. Reeds are harvested and treated. They also visited salt mines.

The market place in Arequipa was extensive. He said women of means wear white hats. He noted mining, agriculture and tourism were the main industries in the country. He showed samples of an experimental terrace where crops were planted at different levels.

He said the cities have narrow streets with lots of traffic and lane lines are virtually ignored, yet the cities are incredibly clean. He noted that virtually no one smokes there.

came the name. He showed photos of several church organs, which were huge and came from Brussels.

He said Peru is an old country struggling to become new. They have solar panels in some areas, but only for lighting. They use Coleman lanterns a lot.

They visited Machu Picchu. The photos he showed were amazing, considering the area covered and elevation, which was about 15,000 feet at the peak. He noted the breathing difficulties they had. It is called Sacred Valley.

He showed photos of construction, noting the Incas used no mortar, no columns or arches. Peru has a variety of animals, including: puma, jaguar and capybara, the world's largest rodent. Tim attempted to tell us the difference between llama, alpaca, vicuna and guanaco.

He told us that Peruvians eat lots of fruits and vegetables, fish and even guinea pig. They also eat llama and alpaca. Since Peru is in the southern hemisphere, they have winter when we have summer. Their rainy season is January - March.
