Program

Chandler Police Chief Sean Duggan brought us up-to-date on his department. He was introduced by Tiffany Jones. Chief Duggan served 28 years with the Scottsdale P.D., including time as Assistant Police Chief before taking over as chief in Chandler January 20, 2014.

He emphasized how the "world of policing" is changing. He said there are three main areas of focus in the Chandler P.D.: personnel, crime and infrastructure. The mission of the force is to ensure that Chandler can be a safe community.

The hiring process is crucial. He noted the force is in a state of transition. He has hired more than 200 employees in his four years. He tries to hire those who are most qualified.

The Chandler P.D. has 332 sworn officers and 180 civilian employees to serve 260,000+ people. Approximately 60 percent of the sergeants and 50 percent of the lieutenants are newly promoted. And yet there are many employees who are eligible for retirement.

"When we know someone is leaving we work on hiring a replacement as far as a year ahead to maintain a smooth transition. Those who are hired must be committed to our vision," he said.

Chief Duggan noted there was a 2.8% decrease in overall crime in Chandler in 2017, that is crimes committed per 1,000 citizens. The crime rate

has remained about the same as the 1980s although there are a lot more people here now.



Many variables affect the crime rate, including technology. Identity theft is one of the biggest new threats. "We focus on what's trending," Chief Duggan said, "put more purpose behind what we do. We have partnerships with regional, state and federal organizations.

"We also have a relationship with the community. We are embedded in the schools, ICAN" and other youth organizations.

A new training center will open soon. The Fire Department has a training facility at Intel in south Chandler. The main police station is being renovated that will include a training center as well as a Victims' Assistance area.

"The City of Chandler is special, very unique," Chief Duggan said. "Many of our employees are natives of the city."
