To this day, he does not eat much ice cream.

He set about designing buildings and became a handyman, but decided he didn't want to do that, so he moved to Arizona at 16 where he graduated from high school.

He was working two jobs, including for TGI Friday's. He caught on with the cooking gig, moved to Las Vegas where he was employed at Harrah's and eventually Caesar's Palace where he worked with celebrities. He moved on to Reno where he bought a special knife which he still has to this day.

Then one Thanksgiving Day his house burned down so he returned to Phoenix with nothing. He lived with his mom and got a job working with a meat company, where the special knife came in handy.

He told of experiences with the meat company, where one of his fellow workers came out of 24 degrees in the plant into 110 degrees outside and dropped dead of a heart attack. Another co-worker cut off his hand

Scott decided that was not for

him, so he went to work for a car dealer and helped them set a sales record. He moved to Minnesota and on to Texas, but returned again to Phoenix where he eventually wound up with Tex Earnhardt, for whom he traveled extensively as a buyer.

Ultimately he got into the mortgage lending business with Freedom Financial. He enjoys big boats, and has taken a 77-footer up the coast to British Columbia.

Scott has had his rough times as well. He lost his wife, son, father and a friend to cancer. We commiserate with Scott in his losses, and wish better days ahead for him.
