Program

Our own Garrett Brolsma, Executive Director of the Chandler Gilbert Family YMCA, brought us up-to-date on that organization, which started in London in 1884. George Williams, who was 22 at the time, started the first Y in the United States in 1851, primarily as a Bible study group.

There are 2,700 facilities overall, including 13 in the Valley as well as others in Yuma and Tucson. The YMCA has 22 million members that generate \$7.2 billion in revenue annually. It is the top non-profit organization in the U.S.

Garrett noted the Chandler Gilbert Y is different from what it was 6-12 months ago. "It has been revitalized," Garrett said. "The Y responds to community needs. Our programs drive the kind of facilities we build.'

Basketball, volleyball and soccer all were started in YMCA facilities, as were the first organized swim lessons. Father's Day was started at the Y in Seattle.
