SINNER-OF-THE-YEAR

Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members posted a record 2,159 fines during the year, easily breaking the mark of 1,915 set two years ago. We had 1,709 fines in 2017.

Previous winners of the award are: Ron Stevens in 1995 and 1996; Randy Kiesel, 1997; Frank Narducci, 1998; Larry Gardner, 1999; Becky Jackson, 2000; Donnette Hermes, 2001; Bill Ryan, 2002 and 2006; Dean Pefanis (our only fourtime winner), 2003-2005 and 2007; Brent Patmos, 2008 and 2009, and he shared the award with John Gizzo and Kurt Rohrs in 2012; Kurt Rohrs also won in 2011; Roger Morsch, 2010, 2015 and 2017; Jim Torgeson, 2013; Sunday Etukeren, 2014; and Soo-San Stevens Clarke, 2016 when she also was Rookie-of-the-Year with a record 333 fines.

Jim announced the fines assessed all 31 members of the club, including those who left during the year: Amanda Alburn and John Gizzo (zero fines each), Phil Lewis (9 fines) and Jim Torgeson (67 fines).

We gained three new members during the year: Gloria Halas, who had 12 fines; Scott Lawless, who had 16 fines; and Terry Locke, who had 84 fines, finished eighth and was declared Rookie-of-the-Year.

Cory Whyte headed off the Top Ten with 77 fines. Brad Raymond was ninth with 83 fines, and Terry Locke eighth with one more than Brad. Marty Herder and Greg Thornton swapped places this year. Marty finished seventh with 103 fines, while Greg was sixth with 131.

Former winner Soo-San Stevens-Clarke finished fifth for a second straight year with 149 fines. Soo's partner in crime, current President Tiffany Jones, was fourth with 151 fines. Pres. Tiffany dropped down from the runner-up spot last year.

That brought us to the Top Three. Brad Raymond introduced the third place finisher, defending champion Roger Morsch, who missed becoming our second four-time winner. He had 152 fines, one more than Tiffany. Brad noted the many moves our club has made over the years, saying that if Roger had his way we probably would move to the bottom of the Grand Canyon, a spothe visits frequently during his many hikes in the Canyon.

Doug Gardner was the runner-up with 165 fines. Doug also received the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club 4-Way Test Award earlier in the program, well-deserved for organizing the rebuilding effort of a home in Houston following Hurricane Harvey last fall. Jim also called to attention Doug's forgetfulness, his love of golf, love of Rotary and love of family.

James Caskey presented the Sinner-of-the-Year Award to PP Theresa Clemmons, who moved up from third last year when she had 106 fines. James noted that Theresa is very competitive. Wants to win all the time. She has taken up golf, but apparently thinks high score wins. She took a lesson from Nick Lacey at San Marcos, who said he thought she got worse after the lesson (Was it the teacher or the student?) She also likes to hang out after work, but there is no truth to the rumor that she has her own personal booth at Blue 32.

Thanks to everyone for their participation this past year. Who knows what may lie ahead!
