#### Board Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club board of directors will be held Tuesday, September 4, at 6:50 a.m. at our regular meeting room at San Marcos.

#### Program

Chris DeRose, clerk of the Maricopa County Superior Court, told us about the court and what it does. He was introduced by Theresa Clemmons.

Court clerks basically execute the judges' decisions. They deal with marriage licenses and other court procedures.

The Maricopa County Superior Court employs 750 people and has a \$7 million annual budget. "Not bad for an entity no one has ever heard of," Chris said.

He noted that Superior Court clerks are appointed in most states, but not in Arizona. He was appointed to the position on March 22 by Governor Doug Ducey when his predecessor retired, but Chris faces re-election this fall.

This is his second job in government. He came from the private sector. He said that the pay is not great. In fact, judges' assistants were making more than the court clerks. Consequently the attrition rate was 25 percent. It costs \$55,000 and six months to train a new clerk.

But changes have been made. Compensation is now based on experience. Since those changes were made, Chris has not lost one employee.

He told us fascinating stories about the Evidence Room, what has been collected and, in some cases, retained through the years. He offered a

The court is involved in \$1 million in transactions daily, but none online, which is inconvenient. Chris said online service will become available soon. And court records will be put online. "We're trying to modernize our system," he said.
