Jim noted there were 28,000 Rotarians and guests at the annual convention. They visited the Hospitality Suite and received several gifts, including a wrist band which had a flashlight in it that could be activated by those in control to create a unique pattern throughout the auditorium.

The convention highlighted Rotary's six areas of focus: peace and conflict prevention/resolution; disease prevention and treatment; water and sanitation; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and economic and community development. Those are in addition to Rotary's continuing efforts to rid the world of polio that was at the forefront of the focus.

The Peace Centers were especially meaningful to Jim. He met with Peter Kyle, Chairman of the Rotary Peace Centers Committee for the last three years, who spoke to our club in February. Jim would like to see our club pursue the installation of a Rotary Peace Pole, probably at a local school.

Center. Major speakers included RI President Ian Risely, General Secretary John Hewko and Rotary Foundation chair Paul Netzel, among others. There were several women among the speakers, including former First Lady Laura Bush, whom Jim thought was especially captivating.

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Toronto Mayor John Tory welcomed Rotarians. A 25-year-old Rotaractor served as MC for each General Session. Jim said she was dynamic.

Each speaker's words were translated into 10 different languages. There also were huge screens around the arena so Rotarians could better see the main stage.

In addition to the General Sessions, there were breakout sessions (hundreds of them), covering every topic about Rotary that you could imagine. There was plenty of entertainment, especially music and dance programs.

Jim and Mary Kay were in the reserved seating for members of the Arch Klumpf Society and were able to relax in the lounge where breakfast and lunch were served. Jim also mentioned the House of Friendship, a place to meet and greet fellow Rotarians from around the world.

Jim urged Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members to attend at least one Rotary International Convention in his/her lifetime. The 2019 convention will be held in Hamburg, Germany, June 1-5. He also urged us to attend the Rotary District 5495 Conference June 20-22 at the Double Tree Resort in Paradise Valley.
