Program

Trinity Donovan, CEO of AZCEND, brought us up-to-date on that organization. She was introduced by Tim Gibson.

Trinity thanked Chandler Horizon Rotary with its involvement with AZCEND, both now and when it was known as the Chandler Christian Community Center, in terms of volunteers and donations since it was founded in 1986. She noted AZCEND has expanded into Gilbert, which was one of the reasons for the name change.

She noted AZCEND is more than a food bank, trying to help move people from crisis to stability to prosperity. "We try to strengthen individuals, families and communities," she said.

AZCEND used to be a clothes bank as well as a food bank. However, they ran out of room so now they work with The Clothes Cabin to handle any clothing received.

AZCEND served more than 17,000 people last year. Since 2008, 5,000 food bags have been handed out to serve 50,000 people. Families average about six visits per year. AZCEND works with the United Food Bank concerning food needs.

Since Trinity arrived nine years ago, AZCEND has branched out to offer five programs. They have nearly 40 staff members, and 1,500 volunteers who last year provided 36,000 hours of service.

The Family Resource Center started in 2010, and includes such services as Early Literacy, Parenting Classes, Child Watch, Operation Santa and Community Health.

AZCEND also offers Homeless Services, helping families acquire affordable housing. They do that through their Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program (I-HELP) and follow it up with Case Management. I-HELP served 415 people last year.

Their Community Action Program (CAP) provides Emergency Financial Assistance, Benefits Connection through organizations such as SAP and AHCCCs, and other services, including VITA, which provides income tax assistance.

AZCEND also has extensive Senior Programs at both the Chandler Senior Center and the Gilbert Senior Center. Meals are provided onsite and through home delivery at the Chandler Center, and meals and activities are provided at the Gilbert Center. Last year 68,000 meals were provided. Their drivers cover 13 routes daily.

Tiffany talked about some of their fund raisers that are coming up, including their gala on September 29, and Empty Bowls on October 16, among others.

She talked about the many ways people can volunteer. Of course, donations are always accepted.
