YMCA Prayer Breakfast

Twenty-two Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members, spouses and friends attended the 12th annual YMCA Prayer Breakfast at the “Y” last Wednesday. They were joined by visiting Rotarian Thomas Arbaugh from Kingsport, Tennessee.

The theme of this year’s event was “Transform.” The thoughts expressed by speakers followed that theme. Transformational speaker Darleen Santore was the MC.

Chandler mayor-elect Kevin Hartke and Gilbert mayor Jenn Daniels were guest speakers. Lisa Cimino, who also sang the National Anthem, issued a blessing of the police, fire and military. There were several representatives of all those present, as was the Chandler High School ROTC unit, which presented the colors. Gina LaBenz issued a blessing of the faith leaders.

Tudor Melville talked about transforming a community, specifically a prison at Rocky Point, which has turned from a bare-bones, 400-person jail to a modern facility with benefits that now houses only 120 prisoners, because so many have been reformed and released. He told personal stories about prisoners, including a minister who faced a 27-year sentence for a crime he didn’t commit, but has been released.

YMCA campaign chair Kevin Miller asked those present to donate to the “Y” to keep its programs going.

The keynote speaker was Dave Muncey, former channel 10 weatherman, who told stories about his life, many of which are included in a book he wrote. During his career as a weatherman, he discovered that children were not getting a proper message about water safety, so he

started a Water Watcher program to help keep kids safe in and around water. The program became highly popular and successful.

Garrett Brolsma, CEO of the YMCA, said that to support child water safety, all swim lessons for children 0-36 months old will be free in 2019. There was a badge at each place indicating every person present was a Water Watcher.
