Program

Jamie Morgan brought us up-to-date on The Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona. She was introduced by Jim Patmos.

Jamie is a member of the board of TRVFA and has been since April. She joined Rotary with the London Bridge club in Lake Havasu City, but now is a member of Mesa West.

She made sure we are aware of the tax credit in Arizona and how any citizen can benefit by donating to TRVFA and receive the tax credit. Any donor also is eligible for a federal tax deduction, although she said the feds have been trying to reduce it to one or the other. With the tax changes effective this year, the increase in the automatic deduction may mean many tax payers will not need to itemize.

When she joined the board one of her goals was to make the TRVFA website easier to contact and easier to navigate. She feels they have made steps in that direction. Everyone should have received a brochure in the mail explaining TRVFA and what it does.

Jamie noted demand has exceeded income this past year so TRVFA is actively seeking increased donations from Rotarians. Chandler Horizon annually donates to TRVFA at our annual Thank You Breakfast following our Hole-in-One Contest. This past year we gave \$1,000 which was reduced from \$1,500 in previous years because of the lower income received from the Hole-in-One Contest.

Facing its current financial crisis, TRVFA has decreased its grant to students from \$3,000 to the present \$2,000. In 2017, TRVFA gave \$160,000 to 77 students. They also have tightened their focus to medical and public service program requests.
