Program

Tim Schauermann told us about his and Nancy's recent trip to Australia, New Zealand, Vietnam and Indonesia. They flew from Phoenix to Los Angeles, on to Sydney, and then spent two days in Fiji.

With people joining the cruise from all over southeast Asia, "we went through a whole bunch of cultures,"

Tim said. He noted that Australia is Christian and European, while Indonesia includes 15,000 islands and is Muslim with a "touch of Hindu. "We went through 40 of the world's great religions in 31 days," he said.

Tim said Sydney is a beautiful city...very cosmopolitan. They used Uber for transportation. "We went through six drivers in three days," Tim said. Not one was a native of Australia. They left their home country for a better opportunity, which was typical of many people they met.

Australia originally was a prison colony. One of the prisons is now a museum. A plaque showed that 300,000 people had walked in one prison. Coal is the major export to Asia. "Australians don't use coal," Tim said. "They ship it to China."

They visited Kimodo Island, famous for Kimodo dragons. They also visited Bali which is in the middle of Indonesia, known for tourism and consumption of rice. Borobudur is a new temple in the middle of a jungle.

Singapore contains the world's second largest port. It is city, island and country. The size of the island was increased when they bought soil from China and dumped it into the ocean.

"Through social security they have built some nice apartments.," Tim said. "There are no homeless, no graffiti and no gum on the street.

Hanoi features limestone and tourism. They turned a former air base into an international airport. They built a large freeway and are in the *Please continue reading on page 2*
