### Program

Larry Gardner told us about his trip from Miami through the Panama Canal and on up to Los Angeles that he took with his brothers, Doug and Wendell, their wives, and other members of their family in early December.

They were on board the Norwegian Star, which was built in 2001 and refurbished in 2008. Not one of the largest cruise ships, it is no small one, either. It has 13 decks and a crew of 1,300. There are 9,000 employees that work for the Panama Canal itself.

The trip through the canal was basically a day-long adventure. A pilot came on board the ship five miles out to help with the process, which included traveling through three separate sections and being lifted 85 feet each time. Each section is 1,060 feet long while the ship is 960 feet long.

Small electric engines help guide the ship through the canal. There was only two feet of space between the ship and the side of the canal, making it a slow-moving process as well.

After passing through the first set of locks the ship moves across Gatun Lake into the Gaillard Cut and then through another set of locks before reaching the Pacific Ocean. The entire trip covers 48 miles. It costs \$500,000 to move a ship through the canal, all paid in advance.

The canal was completed in 1914 at a cost of \$350 million. Prior to its completion, ships had to travel all the way around Cape Horn at the southern tip of South America to go from the Atlantic to the Pacific, or vice versa, a trip more than two times longer.

In addition to the trip through the canal, the group also visited Columbia, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Guatemala and Acapulco, Mexico. Larry showed slides of the trip through the canal as well as some of the other countries they visited.

## Hole-in-One Contest

Here we go, folks!

Our 26<sup>th</sup> annual Hole-in-One Contest starts this Saturday. We will set up Friday at 2 p.m. The list of those who signed up to work this weekend can be found on page 2.

Final details will be worked out at today's meeting.

The plan will be virtually the same as last year: one hole in the finals worth \$100,000. If there is no hole-in-one in the finals, there will be alternate prizes of \$5,000 for closest to the hole, \$2,500 for next closest and \$1,000 for third closest. We will have 20 shooters in the finals.

If no one gets an ace in the \$20,000 Women's Shootout, the closest to the pin will receive \$500. There will be 10 shooters in the Women's Shootout.

Any hole-in-one during qualifying will earn a shot in the finals. If there is no hole-in-one on a particular qualifying day, the closest to the pin will earn a shot in the finals. Any shot within 30 inches of the pin in qualifying will earn a shot in the semifinals.

We will have seven daily prizes for the seven closest shots to the pin. This year each day's prizes will be given to the winner on the next qualifying day.

We also will have the Silent Auction this year, with a few new twists. Part of the auction display will be set up in the lobby of the San Marcos clubhouse. And there will be a 50-50 drawing
