President Theresa Clemmons conducted a Club Assembly last week. We made final preparations for our 26th annual Hole-in-One Contest.

A major point of emphasis was the work schedule for the first weekend. There were some holes that needed to be filled, particularly on Saturday afternoon.

Once again, if you have not signed up to work for the final two weekends, please do so today. You can log on to SignupGenius.com to do so. Pres. Theresa sent out an email Thursday with this coming weekend's needs. Check it and, even if you have already signed up to work some shifts, please sign up for more to make sure we are covered in all areas: registration desk including the Silent Auction, and on the green.

Shifts are from 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m., 12:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m., and 3:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. each day of qualifying. Also remember to show up on time and be prepared to work your full shift, especially the final shift of the day when signs, banners, balls and other items have to be picked up and stored.

Pres. Theresa explained changes in the Silent Auction this year. Items from All American Classics are on display in the lobby of the San Marcos pro shop. Local items will be on display in the tent adjacent to the registration desk. Some of those items will have a bid sheet to sign. For others, raffle-type tickets will be sold. The ticket may be placed in a box in front of the item. On the day of the finals, a ticket will be drawn from each of the boxes and the winning ticket holder can claim the item.

We also will have the 50-50 drawing similar to last year. The winning ticket will be drawn on the day of the finals.

Hole-in-One Contest

The end result, however, was one of our best weekends ever. Saturday was our second best opening day. And Sunday was our best second day ever. With few shooters Monday morning we loaded up from mid- to late-afternoon and came in with our seventh best third day. We wound up with our best first weekend, passing the previous best in 2009 by a little more than \$500.

We had two holes-in-one Saturday, plus one Sunday and another Monday. We had no holes-in-one the first weekend last year. In addition to the holes-in-one, we had 64 shots in the circle for the weekend. We had a total of 13 women shooters over the three days. That compares with 19 women shooters and 48 shots in the circle for last year's opening weekend.

Now the trick is to keep it going. The weather forecast for the upcoming weekend is not great, basically more of the same... possible rain Thursday with chilly conditions through the weekend. We made it through last weekend, we should be able to do it again.
