Dave is a native of Tucson. His dad was a teacher and principal. His mom grew up on a farm in Kansas, where she was involved in 4-H. She also became a teacher.

Dave grew up on a farm and raised pigs. "Eventually we moved to the city — Apache Junction," he said. "Basketball became my life. I tried football but didn't like to hit people. I tried baseball but my strike zone was too big."

He graduated from high school as valedictorian of the class of 1992. Then on to Mesa Community College where he played basketball under coach Tom Bennett, who is Dave's idol. He moved on to the Colorado School of Mines where he became an engineer and worked at Intel, but decided he didn't want to be an engineer. He wanted to be a basketball coach.

He earned his BS degree in math at Northern Arizona University. He and Sara have been married 20 years. She is a chemistry teacher at Hamilton High. They have three children: Tom, 15, who is a freshman; Abby, 13, in seventh grade; and Ethan, who is in first grade.

Club Assembly

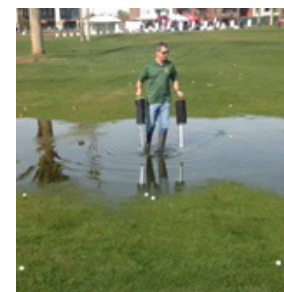
With our 26th annual Hole-in-One Contest completed, we'll have a Club Assembly to assess the event and its success, or lack thereof.

Hole-in-One Contest

We made it through the first trying weekend of our 26th annual Hole-in-One Contest only to find more challenges awaited us in the second weekend.

Prolonged rain Thursday and on into Friday forced postponement of activities on Friday. That day's events were moved to Monday, giving us a second straight week of Saturday-Monday. Thanks to Ron Stevens, Marty Herder and others who were able to get the word out, shooters showed up Monday in force, giving us a good day financially, and the most shots within 30 inches of the pin of any day so far.

Not only did we have 33 shots in the circle (giving us 140 through the first six days), but we also had two holes-in-one, giving us 11 for the six days. Two of the aces were recorded by women, Linda Wenniger and Bonnie Moore. We have had 33 women shooters thus far. Two other aces were recorded by former overall winners Steve Hewitt (2012) and James Downes (2016). Ironically, both of those came this past Saturday.

That's the most holes-in-one we've had since 2013 and we still have two qualifying sessions to go. They will be this

coming Friday and Saturday.

Financially there has been only one year where we've raised more money for shots, the Silent Auction and the 50-50 drawing. That was in 2001, and that year is only a few hundred dollars ahead of this year through six days.

So, this Friday and Saturday will determine the number of shooters in Sunday's semifinals. They will begin at 1 p.m., followed by the Women's \$20,000 Shootout at 2 p.m. and the overall finals at 2:30 p.m.

The school has many “give back projects,” including a program where students work all four years to achieve goals they set for themselves as freshmen.

He thanked Terry Locke for helping him put down his roots. Dave started on his doctorate 10 years ago. “I miss teaching,” he said. “Eventually I’d like to get my doctorate and teach math in a community college somewhere.”
