Board Meeting Postponed

Program

Mike Sorce, the CEO of LiveLove, told us about that organization. a non-profit community development working alongside neighborhood leaders in the downtown Chandler area who are striving to create change and healthy growth right where they live. It has been around since 2007. He was introduced by Marty Herder.

They serve 120 families. They have plans for a new facility, Oasis Community Project, for which they hope to break ground within 90 days. They hope to provide a large community garden, a landscaped space for families to celebrate important occasions, a learning space where teens and adults can further develop vocational skills, and an area for sports and recreation.

They have a team of volunteers, but no paid staff. They will sponsor a 5-K run April 6 as a fundraiser, but otherwise are funded through private donations.

They also have a food bank to serve the area. They served 1,000 food boxes at Thanksgiving and 1,200 at another event in December. They have built three houses on Delaware Street for LiveLove families.

Live Love works with local schools on an indirect basis. The success of the entire program is based on sustainability, Mike said.

LiveLove also serves globally in such areas as Haiti and Malawi, among others. They supported Gabi Herder on her trip to Malawi last year.

Hole-in-One Contest

The final weekend of the 26th annual Hole-in-One Contest came to a close Sunday with the Semifinals, Women's Shootout Finals and the Overall Finals. After the last ball was struck, Rich Perry came away with the alternate prize of \$5,000 after putting his shot in the finals 9'9¹/₂" from the 155-yard pin.

He didn't win the \$100,000 grand prize (which goes unclaimed for yet another year) but he bettered 27 other shooters in the finals. Linda Wenniger finished second at 13'11" and claimed a \$2,500 check. Rich and Linda were the final two shooters in the finals. Ajae Slayton won \$1,000 for finishing third at 14'11/2".

All three posted holes-in-one in qualifying, where we had a total of 18, the most since 2009 when we had 20. We had 19 in 2008. There were six last year.

We had at least one hole-in-one every day, including four on the final Friday when last year's winner, Joe Yanes, had two within about 10 minutes of each other.

Cynthia Cannaert won the Women's Shootout with a shot of 14'3". She didn't get an ace for \$20,000, but she did receive a check for \$500. The victory was her eighth in the 13 years of the event

We had 204 shots in the semifinals, the most since 2012, when we had 233. We had 155 last year

Despite weather problems throughout the event, we had an excellent turnout of shooters. There were cool and windy conditions the first weekend. The second Friday was rained out, but we were able to make up that day on Monday, although we danced around water puddles. The final Friday was beautiful and the final Saturday started out gorgeous although a brief rain shower mid-morning sent shooters scurrying for about half an hour, but they returned when the sun came out and we had a strong finish.

Final financial figures are yet to come, but it is virtually assured that we will have the best year ever. Not only was money from shots among the best, but when the recent additions of the 50-50 drawing and the Silent Auction are added in, our bottom line should be right up there.
