Board Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was held Tuesday.

The board received the Hole-in-One financial statement for both 2019 and 2018 and discussed differences. There still is some sponsor money yet to come in, but there also will be more expense.

As of now, our income is about \$4,000 higher and expenses about \$7,000 lower than last year, giving us a bottom line a little more than \$10,000 above last year, which was a down year. A full report will be presented to the club at our Club Assembly April 3.

The board also discussed potential recipients of funds at our annual Thank You Breakfast May 1. Once a more definitive financial report is available, both our club and foundation boards will meet to determine which organizations will receive funds, and how much to each.

The board also discussed ways to honor non-Rotarians who gave extra effort at the Hole-in-One Contest.

The board accepted with regret the resignation of Doug Hawkins from the board. Bruce Dransfeldt was appointed by the board to serve the remainder of Doug's term on the board through June 30, 2019.

Since we no longer have the connection with Chandler High School and its Interact Club, the board approved giving two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating seniors from Basha High School, where we are working to establish an Interact club.

The board approved renewal of our membership in the Chandler Chamber of Commerce. It is hoped we will get even more cooperation and support from the Chamber for our Hole-in-One Contest
