hand sanitizer; list of documentations; toothpaste, toothbrush, comb and razor; bottle of drinking water; notebook and pen; granola bars; first aid kit; trash bags; whistle; waterproof match container; and a compass.

Jamie emphasized how important these items are, as are other lists: family emergency plan; personal record; medication records and health history; and a health event log. She urged us to make copies of these documents and keep them on our person or at least in our cars. She handed out a packet of informational papers that she urged us to fill out.

She also suggested we stock up on groceries at home, especially water (about one gallon per person per day). Each family needs to make a plan and talk about it.

She talked about home care, especially for an older person who may live alone. She offered elec-



tronic caregiver plans that will help seniors and the chronically disabled remain independent in their homes for as long as possible by providing geriatric care management service, transitional care and assisted living placement.
