Program

David Loutzenheiser told us about Basha Gives Back, a student-based program which was started seven years ago at Basha High School. Students start on the project when they are freshmen, work on the bibliography as sophomores, develop their paper as juniors and make presentations when they are seniors.

David introduced three senior girls who told us about their project: Oldies but Goodies. Brianna Persiani, Natalie Burgos and Inaara Peermohammad had created a video showing the steps the group of 10-12 went through to create their overall product. Unfortunately, there were some technical difficulties and we were unable to see the video in its entirety.

But they told us their main objective was to create more connection with senior citizens. They have made presentations to the elderly in nursing homes and assisted living facilities as well as at our Rotary club. They discovered that as people age they tend to make fewer connections.

Brianna explained that she was in the Girl Scouts most of her life and won the Gold Award. She also has had a strong connection with her 90-year-old grandmother.

A singing club was formed at Basha with the assistance of counselor Elizabeth Fritsche. Brianna noted all her group members have a passion for music, plus they earn community service hours for their participation. They have appeared at Archstone Care Center, Solterra and Solera.

They are trying to show greater respect for the elder generation, contribute to Basha's prestigious reputation and showcase the talent of Basha High students. They faced challenges of recruiting, ride and communication problems, and conflicting schedules in setting rehearsals and performances, yet they enjoyed the experience of giving back.

Now that they have appeared before our Rotary club, they hope to continue their performances, and perhaps get on TV some day. But they have money issues as well. The ultimate goal is to find more ways to give back to the community in an
