in Mesa. NAFFA was founded in 2001 by one father — hers, who met with others in an attempt to improve family life. Today NAFFA works with more than 240 tribes and agencies.

Native Americans are on top of every list in terms of suicide, drug and alcohol abuse, as well as others. Amy told the success story of Mike Duncan, “who was an evil person, but through counseling was able to turn his life around,” she said. “Change must come from within through feelings.”

Traditionally, programs for Native American families were focused on women and children, not so much men. “We’re trying to improve on that,” she said.

NAFFA offers assistance and help in two ways: 1) to truly love the people whom we serve; and 2) to love what we bring to the people we serve. “Sacredness is a deep traditional value of native people,” Amy said. “NAFFA helps individuals understand their role as mothers and fathers.”

NAFFA has three effective curricula: First, fatherhood/motherhood is sacred. NAFFA sacred principles include service, wisdom, teachable, choice and creed.

Second, linking generations by strengthening relationships. There are five ways to improve relationships: kindness, safety, fairness, appreciation, joy and laughter.

And third, addressing family violence and abuse. “Motherhood is the greatest creation of our Creator,” Amy said. She said they are

working on other issues, including suicide prevention and grandparents raising grandchildren, among others.

Amy said NAFFA receives no federal or state grants. Tribes buy certification for their employees.

The NAFFA 16th annual “Fatherhood is Leadership” national conference will be held October 15-17 at We-Ko-Pa Resort and Conference Center at Fort McDowell. If you would like more information, call 480-833-5007.
