Club Assembly

President Theresa Clemmons conducted a Club Assembly where we heard more details about our 26th annual Hole-in-One Contest.

Pres. Theresa thanked everyone for their participation, both in gaining sponsors and daily prizes as well as working shifts at the event itself.

Jim Hoenig gave a financial report, noting it was our best year ever, combining shots, the Silent Auction and the 50-50 drawing. Overall income was improved, expenses were down and we finished about \$11,000 ahead of last year.

He noted we still have some outstanding sponsor money and we may have a few additional expenses. He handed out a report showing the totals from this year as well as several past years.

We had 204 semifinal qualifiers, 18 holes-in-one and 38 women shooters. That compared with 155 semifinal qualifiers, six holes-in-one and 56 female shooters in 2018.

The female shooter totals included those who may have participated more than once. Ron Stevens gave statistics showing we had 24 different female shooters this year, compared with 32 in 2018 and 21 in 2017, our first year on the driving range at San Marcos. He suggested ways we might increase the total number of female shooters.

Jim noted we had 265 member shifts this year. That total included not only members, but spouses and friends of members as well. That compared with 274 last year. The only outside help we had was from the Basha Interact Club that provided five students, although some came more than once. Last year we had help from 11 Chandler Police Department Explorers and six from AZCEND.

Marty Herder gave a marketing report, noting we came in under budget. He talked about print media advertising, social media advertising and word-of-mouth advertising.

Everyone agreed advancements in social media plus the efforts of Marty, Ron and Cory Whyte, among others, were an important factor in this year's success, enabling us to let shooters know we were closed down on one Friday and we were
