### Program

We were treated to a special appearance by the 16<sup>th</sup> President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln. President Lincoln gave a narration of his life, focusing on his years in government.



He talked about his debates with Steven A. Douglas while running for Senator from Illinois on the newly formed Republican Party platform in 1868. He lost the election but gave a speech in February of 1960 declaring it was the duty of our country to oppose slavery. The speech was printed in major U.S. newspapers, leading to his

nomination and election to the presidency in November.

During his first inaugural address he assured Congress he didn't want war. But the disagreement in the nation over slavery continued to fester. On April 12, 1861, rebel forces attacked Fort Sumter. On July 4, President Lincoln called on Congress to send 400,000 men into battle at a cost of \$400 million.

President Lincoln noted he and his wife, Mary, lost their son, William, at the age of 11 in February of 1862. Another son, Tad, died at 18.

In August of 1862, the rebels claimed a major victory in the second battle of Bull Run. The Union forces battled back and won the battle at Antietam in September. General McClelland failed to follow through, however, and Lincoln removed him from command in December.

Several replacements met with a certain amount of victory, but also several defeats. Pres. Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation *Please continue reading on page 2*

**ABRAHAM LINCOLN**

on January 1, 1863. Immediately it eliminated slavery only in the confederate states, but eventually it was a factor in eliminating slavery in all states, and set an example for freedom for slaves throughout the world.

In an attempt to bring about greater peace, in October, 1963, Pres. Lincoln issued a proclamation declaring the fourth Thursday of November as Thanksgiving Day. On November 19, a new cemetery was dedicated at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The principal speaker was noted orator Edward Everett who rambled on for two hours.

President Lincoln's speech was about two minutes, but has been remembered far longer than the words of Everett. Pres. Lincoln recited the Gettysburg address for us. He also gave us several snippets from his inauguration speeches and other speeches given during his lifetime, including a letter he penned to a mother in Massachusetts who had lost five sons in the war.

Led by Generals Ulysses S. Grant and William T. Sherman, the Union gained more victories and, when

Grant took Richmond and Sherman took Atlanta, the war was over. The rebel forces surrendered to Grant at Appomattox Court House on April 9, 1965.

Lincoln had won re-election in November, 1964, defeating George McClelland.

On April 19, 1865, he and Mary went to Ford's Theater to see his favorite play, "Our American Cousin." "I will leave you now," he said.

Jim Patmos arranged President Lincoln's visit, and identified him as trial lawyer Glynn Gilcrease, who is a member of the Tempe South Rotary Club. He told us about his own personal time spent in the armed services, how he met "Mary" and how he worked creating his presentation.

It was well-received and appreciated by all.
