Katelynn Dean Presents Program on Homeward Bound Service in Chandler

Katelynn Dean, Associate Director of Community and Youth programs for Homeward Bound, told us about that organization. She was introduced by Roger Morsch.

Homeward Bound is a 501 (c) 3 organization serving Phoenix and other cities, including Chandler, where it is associated with the Chandler Unified School District. It serves homeless youth, primarily from 16-18 years old, helping them find homes and get through high school and beyond.

They have about 76 apartments in the Valley for families, or a single parent with a dependent child. Residents must sign a one-year lease.

Katelynn noted that teens are homeless for a variety of reasons. She said that "homelessness is cyclical and generational." There are 62,000 homeless youth in Arizona. She said homeless youth are four times more likely to drop out of school and are twice as likely to become unemployable adults.

Homeward Bound is committed to: 1) offer quarterly personal development seminars; 2) offer no charge academic tutoring and counseling

services; 3) offer a monthly stipend of up to \$145 for students who meet the guidelines; and 4) offer additional support from collaborating agencies.

A student must: be referred by their school district; sign and follow a Contract of Expectations; have a passing grade of at least "C" per class and an overall 2.0 or better GPA; have teachers complete and submit monthly signed reports regarding

Board Meeting

The Board of Directors held its regular monthly meeting Tuesday.

The board discussed members who are delinquent in dues.

Club Treasurer Larry Gardner presented a report comparing carryover funds from year to year for the past two years. He predicted we will have a carryover from this year to next better than those last two years. He also recommended we make no changes in our dues structure at this time.

The board approved splitting the cost of the Thank You Breakfast with the Chandler Horizon Rotary Foundation, after meals payments made by members have been subtracted. The cost to the Foundation will be \$422.50.

The board requested transferring Foundation funds to the Reserve Fund immediately. The move, previously approved by both boards, will bring the Reserve Fund to \$15,000.

The board discussed member donations to The Rotary Foundation's Every Member Every Year program. An invoice will be sent out to those members who have not donated their \$100 for this Rotary year.

The board discussed honorary membership possibilities in our club.

The board also approved erecting a Peace Pole, probably at Basha High School. More information will be forthcoming.

The board also voted to seek recognition from the City of Chandler for our club's service to the community in a reserved area at Tumbleweed Park.

their attendance and behavior; and attend personal development seminars.

There are 58 youth currently enrolled in Chandler, most of whom will graduate soon. It has been found that youth in the Homeward Bound program do better in schools, care more about school and are better problem solvers. Homeward Bound works with school counselors on teen suicide and sex/labor trafficking.

Homeward Bound has received a grant from Dignity Health, but that is about to run out, so they are looking for \$15-18,000 to fund the 2019-20 school year.
