### Program

Mary Murphy-Baxter and Lisa Henry presented a program on the Pregnancy Care Center. They were introduced by Soo-San Stevens-Clarke.

The Pregnancy Care Center opened in Chandler in 2007. A branch in Gilbert was opened in 2015. Mary has been with the Center for nine years, but is retiring soon. Lisa will serve as Mary's replacement.

Mary thanked us for our friendship and for donating to the Center for as long as she can remember. The Pregnancy Care Center is a non-profit 501 c (3) organization that assists women facing an unplanned pregnancy.

They provide free services including pregnancy tests, counseling, referrals and resources as well as ultrasounds. In no way do they suggest or promote abortion.

"We lovingly and accurately discuss all options so our clients can make an informed choice," Mary said. Their clients range in age from 18-34. She noted that clients gain confidence and develop relationships.

Often when a client who is considering abortion sees the ultrasound and hears the heartbeat of their baby, 85 percent of them change their mind. Many of their clients do not have the support of a family member.

She said they see a lot of young women in an unplanned pregnancy who are from well-to-do homes. She noted that for the most part millennials don't value marriage, but the Center has been

Learn and Earn is a key program at the Center which allows parents to learn the skills they need while earning credit toward brand new baby items from their boutique.

The Center works with the Chandler Unified School District as well as with community assistance programs. They have served more than 2,000 cases since 2007.

The Pregnancy Care Center is funded by businesses, churches, fundraising events and individuals. They receive no state or federal funding. Their next big fundraiser is the Fall Banquet Tuesday, October 8.

The Center has a small paid staff but is run primarily by volunteers. They have a staff of four and
