Debbie Newport, Director of Community Relations for Copper Creek Inn Memory Care Community, told us about that facility. Chris Frere, Executive Director of Copper Creek Inn, also attended the meeting. They were introduced by Kurt Rohrs.

Out of necessity, Debbie became interested in memory care when her mom was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. She and her sister, Audrey, visited several facilities involved in memory care. They finally found Copper Creek Inn. Debbie was so impressed and, wanting to stay close to her mom, she went to work there last October.

Copper Creek Inn is one of 30 communities in seven states that are part of Koelsch Communities, which has been serving seniors since 1958.

Debbie said dementia is an umbrella term that affects one percent of adults 60-or-over. The term includes Alzheimer's and vascular dementia as well as other forms of dementia, and can include Parkinson's and other mental health diseases.

Families have several options in terms of treatment and care for a family member including: adult day programs, in-home care, assisted living, residential care homes, adult family or group homes, nursing home care and memory care communities.

She noted that memory care can cost \$60,000+ per year. It is not covered by the government, although some veterans may be covered.

Debbie handed out a brochure that explained steps a family should take in gaining the proper care for a senior loved one with memory issues
