#### **Larry Horton Presents Program on Rotary Youth Leadership Awards**



Larry Hoover (above, right) brought us up-todate on the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. He was introduced by PP Theresa Clemmons.

Larry talked about the purpose and intent of RYLA. When former Rotary districts 5490 and 5510 merged into District 5495, the two RYLA camps were retained, Pinerock Camp for the west side in Prescott and Camp Ponderosa for the east side in Heber-Overgaard. Pinerock can accept about 120 campers per year while Camp Ponderosa is limited to 80 campers.

High school juniors- and seniors-to-be attend the camp over a long weekend. He said that the kids gather for the bus trip to Camp Ponderosa and don't know each other. But that doesn't last long.

The camp provides a bonding experience that could last for a lifetime. At the same time they learn leadership skills that they can take back to their schools where they are involved in Interact, and possibly on to Rotary Youth Exchange and Rotaract.

The campers learn about Rotary, the 4-Way Test, engage in team events and improve their public speaking skills and confidence. "There's a lot of fun stuff," Larry said.

Campers also participate in a public service project similar to Feed My Starving Children called Manzanita Outreach. The main difference is meals bagged for Manzanita Outreach stay in Arizona, primarily going to the Navajo Nation in Apache County, the most food-starved county in the U.S.

Camp wraps up Saturday night with a dance and an awards ceremony. When the campers return home and spread the word, "it's like a ripple effect throughout the district," Larry said.

He noted that volunteers are needed. RYLA at Camp Ponderosa will be held next April, and then return in October when there will be a change in time schedule.

It is hoped Chandler Horizon Rotary will be able to send at least two students, probably from Basha High, to RYLA camp next spring.



#### **Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona**

Jim Patmos introduced Alfredo Pulido (above right), who has received a scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 from The Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona. Alfredo is a student at the East Valley Institute of Technology in the HVAC program. He has six sisters and is the second in his family to graduate. He hopes he might be able to help his dad someday. His dad is a cook for Banner Health. Alfredo is sponsored by Chandler Horizon Rotary. Jim reminded everyone that donations to TRVFA are eligible for an Arizona tax credit.
