The Clothes Cabin started by providing socks to those in need. When their supply facility closed they were able to move into an empty classroom in the Chandler Unified School District. They became a non-profit in 2009 and their footprint in the community became even larger.

Today they serve 107 ZIP codes. In 2018 they served 12,933 individuals, including 2,002 new individuals. They gave out 81,864 articles of assistance, and provided 366 loads of laundry for the homeless, while posting 9,388 hours of volunteer service.

They not only provide clothing of all types for all ages, but also offer storage lockers, mailboxes and weekly laundry service to any unsheltered individual for as long as needed. Their Warm 4 Winter event provides blankets, food and warm clothing to anyone experiencing homelessness.

They provide small, travel-size hygiene items and give new families a welcome kit that contains hygiene and household items, including linens Please continue reading on page 2


Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona

and blankets. They also provide steel-toe or non-slip shoes on a one-time basis for those who need them



for work. Professional and laborrelated clothing is also provided.

People can visit once every three months. It is a barrier-free program. Outside program services include the Operation Back to School program, Clothing Share-Out Program and community classes.

They are able to do this through the generous donations of caring people in the community. Amanda says she occasionally has to turn away donations because they don't have space and enough time to sort all of it.

That's where more volunteers can help. That's where their new building also will help. A new facility is under construction at 710 South Cooper Road, just south of Guadalupe in Gilbert. They will be moving from their current location at Ray and Alma School whenever the new building is ready, hopefully sometime in November.

They will have classrooms, more lockers and showers, more display and storage space, and their own laundry facilities. "We can't wait," Amanda said.

They have annual fundraisers, including the No More Chilly Nights event. If you would like to donate or volunteer, you can contact Amanda at www.onesmallspace.org.
