Theresa Clemmons Is Repeat Winner of Sinner-of-the-Year Award; Holds Off Soo-San Stevens-Clarke

Past President Theresa Clemmons (left in photo) has won the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club Sinner-of-the-Year award for a second straight year. Following her victory in 2017-18 when she tallied 270 fines, PP Theresa won this year with 209. Soo-San Stevens Clarke finished second with 176.

Jim Hoenig (right) and other members of the Sergeant-at-Arms Committee made the presentation at last week's meeting. Other members of the Sergeant-at-Arms Committee are James Caskey, Brad Raymond and Bill Ryan.

Jim reminded members, especially new members, how the Sinner-of-the-Year award works. Fines collected for various "sins" throughout the year are duly noted and tabulated at the end of the Rotary year. Some confessions that are of higher value are credited toward the donor's Paul Harris Fellow and not counted toward the Sinner-of-the-Year.

Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members posted 1,859 fines during the year, some 300 short of the record 2,159 set the previous year.

Previous winners of the award are: Ron Stevens in 1995 and 1996; Randy Kiesel in 1997; Frank Narducci in 1998; Larry Gardner in 1999; Becky Jackson in 2000; Donnette Hermes in 2001; Bill Ryan in 2002 and 2006; Dean Pefanis (our only four-time winner) in 2003-2005 and 2007; Brent Patmos in 2008 and 2009; and Brent shared the award with John Gizzo and Kurt Rohrs in 2012; Kurt also won in 2011; Jim Torgeson in 2013; Sunday Etukeren in 2014; Roger Morsch in 2010, 2015 and 2017; and Soo-San Stevens-Clarke in 2016, when she also was Rookie-of-the-Year with a record 333 fines.

Jim announced the fines assessed all 33 members of the club, including those who left during the year: Scott Lawless (5 fines), Doug Hawkins (11), Garrett Brolsma (13) and Gloria Halas (28).

 of-the-Year.

Marty Herder was seventh for a second straight year, this time with 94 fines, nine fewer than the previous year. Terry Locke, Rookie of the Year last year when he finished eighth with 84 fines, was sixth this year with 94.

John Leslie finished fifth with 101 fines. John is a former member and past president of the club. He left for a while and then came back. Since he is a returning member, he no longer is considered a rookie and was not eligible for the Rookie-of-the-Year award.

Three-time winner Roger Morsch finished fourth this time, with 118 fines, 34 fewer than last year when he finished third.

That brought us to the Top Three. James Caskey introduced the third place finisher, new President Greg Thornton with 143 fines. Pres. Greg

finished sixth last year with 131. James noted Pres. Greg's many contributions to the club, including serving as chair of the Golf Committee. James also noted what a nice guy Greg is, so nice in fact, he let two others finish ahead of him in the Sinner-of-the-Year award race.

Brad Raymond introduced the runner-up: Soo-San Stevens-Clarke with 176 fines. She finished sixth the last two years after winning the award in 2016 with a record 333 fines. She also was Rookie-of-the-Year that year. Brad noted that Soo has made more memorial tributes to family members than anyone else in the club, so much so that she has her own line item in the Foundation financial report. She also has been active working on service community projects and getting other members to join her. She also has great love for her family, especially her grandbaby.

Jim presented PP Theresa her second straight Sinner-of-the-Year award. He noted how Theresa had stepped in when health issues forced President Tiffany Jones to resign. He also mentioned her work on the Hole-in-One Contest. Jim talked about the support Theresa gets not only from club members, but also from Pres. Greg and Kristin Lindsey in the office as well as from her husband, Jeff, at home. She loves to cook and also loves her adult beverages. It hasn't been all peaches and cream this year, however. Losing her mom and step-dad over a short period of time has been a tough pill to swallow.

Thanks to everybody for their participation this past year. Theresa indicated she would like to relinquish the title to someone else in the new year. Who is ready to step up?
