Program

PDG Keith Hooper brought us up-to-date on The H.E.L.P. Foundation, an organization that he and his wife, Paterna, founded in the Philippines in 2003. Keith was introduced by Doug Gardner, a former classmate of Keith's in Smith Center, Kansas.

Doug gave a review of Keith's extended life: graduating from Kansas State, joining the Peace Corps where he met Pat, serving in the Army and as a magistrate, and also spending time as a District Governor of Rotary in Kansas.

HELP stands for Humanitarian Effort to Lessen Poverty of underprivileged children in the Philippines. They work primarily in the Bukidnon area. The Philippines now have more than 100 million people. There are 7,107 islands in the Philippines which also has 88 different dialects.

The Philippines were controlled by the Spanish for 300 years, then the United States after the Spanish-American War, then the Japanese in World War II, and the U.S. again before gaining their sovereignty on July 4, 1946.

Bighoop Charities are also a supporter of the H.E.L.P. Foundation. The Foundation received a Rotary Global Grant of \$101,000 in 2015. Keith handed out a brochure and newsletter highlighting many of the activities of the Foundation.

They have established a very successful microcredit program for women. ("They're more productive and efficient," Keith said.) The program has 500 clients. They provide livelihood training for low-income mothers so they can start their own *Please continue reading on page 2*
