Program

Brian Jones told us about Jacob's Hope, a clinic for newborns who are suffering from Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome, or withdrawal from pre-natal exposure to drugs. He was introduced by Chuy Ortiz.

"It was founded on a mother's love," Brian said. Jacob was adopted in 1988 by Brian and Jo Jones. As a newborn he had symptoms and behaviors of a little baby addicted to drugs. Although Brian and Jo didn't know what his illness was or how to care for him, "we did our best and loved him with all of our hearts," Brian said. Due to pre-natal exposure, Jacob suffered from the effects of substance abuse for his entire life. He died in 2014.

With the help of a pastor and Jo's friend, Leslie Blowers, they were slowly able to develop a clinic to treat newborns with similar issues. It has been a struggle, and Brian and Jo needed help from state and federal agencies to be able to get the clinic approved and operational.

More than 6,000 Arizona newborns are affected by prenatal drug and alcohol exposure every year. The effects of drug exposure on newborns can result in low birth weight, premature birth, failure to thrive, infectious diseases and neurobehavioral symptoms, among other issues.

medical care between hospital and home for medically compromised newborns in three general areas.

1) Focused infant care. As skilled medical staff is available 24/7 to provide individualized medical treatment using specific therapeutic techniques. Right now they are able to accommodate up to 12 infants. If they have that many there are two RNs and four CNAs present at all times.

2) Parental support. Parent visitation time is available to help learn infant care techniques through non-judgmental interactions.

3) Long-term connections. Jacob's Hope partners with state agencies, provides resources for success and there is on-going follow-up.

Brian related many of the issues they faced before they could become certified. Jacob's Hope is licensed by ADHS and credentialed by AHCCCS. They have a working agreement with Abbott Nutrition and Sonora Quest Labs. He noted DCS has been a big help with assistance.

Soo-San Stevens Clarke pre-
