Board Meeting

The Board of Directors held its regular monthly meeting Tuesday.

Club Treasurer Larry Gardner reported he and Foundation Treasurer Jim Hoenig have been working on getting the Foundation financials set up on QuickBooks. There have been some problems, but Larry, Jim and Theresa Clemmons will continue working on them until everything can be set up and working properly. There was discussion about some of the issues involved.

Membership Chair Roger Bonngard discussed a proposal to update our club's structure that would involve more members and become more efficient. He and Roger Morsch will present a program on membership at our November 20 meeting.

Some of his ideas will be discussed by a committee of five members appointed by President Greg Thornton who will work on a revision of our by-laws.

Ron Stevens made a proposal about adding a putting contest to our Hole-in-One event. Because of time constraints, action on the proposal was tabled until the December board meeting.

Mayor Kevin Hartke Gives CHRC Members Update on City of Chandler

We were happy to welcome Mayor Kevin Hartke, who gave us an update on the City of Chandler. He was introduced by Jim Patmos.

Mayor Hartke was elected to a four-year term as mayor in 2017. He previously served on the City Council, including two terms as Vice Mayor. He has served as pastor of Trinity Christian Fellowship since 1985. He and his wife have four children.

His goal is to provide the city with a consolidated plan, stay on focus, provide excellent service and to be a fiscal conservative mayor.

He views Chandler as a World Class city that provides an excellent way of life that has a focus on innovation and technology with infill and redevelopment becoming more important.

He noted the Chandler Unified School District is one of the Top 50 in the nation. He cited accomplishments by some of its schools, including Si Se Puede that was third in a world robotics competition. Hamilton recently won the Babe Ruth World Series baseball title.

Mayor Hartke discussed economic development, listing several new businesses and the fact 1,000 new jobs are moving to Chandler, many of them relocating. There are 5,600 new jobs in 2019 alone. He noted rumors of a recession, saying we need to preserve our resources. He said the unemployment rate in Chandler is less than the state and national average.

He said Chandler has a current population of

about 262,000. The average age is 35.5 and is similar to neighboring Gilbert. Chandler has a \$927 million budget which is about a 9.5% increase. Chandler is one of 40 cities in the United States to hold a AAA rating, due to its excellent fiscal policies. The city is about 90 percent "built out." He promised a two-year hiatus from street construction downtown.

Mayor Hartke noted we have five employment corridors that need to be preserved. 1) Price, where there are 40,000 jobs and 15 Fortune 500 companies; 2) West Chandler, with 28,000 jobs; 3) Airport, with 9,400 jobs and is the fastest growing; 4) Uptown Chandler with 11,200 jobs; and Downtown that will have 12 new restaurants in New Square when it opens in 2020.

We also need to increase mobility and solve transportation needs. He called Chandler the **Please continue reading on page 2**
