Rotary District 5495 Governor David Simmer Makes His Official Visit



Rotary District 54405 Governor David Simmer paid his official visit to Chandler Horizon Rotary last week. He was introduced by Assistant Governor Jay Jones.

Governor David lived in Boston for 30 years. He has been a record store owner. He moved to Arizona in 2010 and has been Secretary, Treasurer and President of the Sedona Rotary Club. He has served as District Leadership Chair and District Rotary Foundation Chair.

Gov. David presented this year's Rotary International banner to President Greg Thornton. He also made two special presentations. One was the Rotary Citation with Silver Distinction to Theresa Clemmons (above photo), for her work serving as president of CHRC for more than one year. Only seven of 70 clubs in the district received that award.

The second was the Rotary Connects the World award which was presented to Jim Patmos (above, right) and Soo-San Stevens-Clarke for their work in helping to promote Rotary around the world. Gov. Dave noted that usually only one is awarded to each club, but both Jim and Soo were more than worthy.

Gov. Dave focused his message to us on The Rotary Foundation. He said that when he first joined Rotary his thoughts and efforts were toward making a difference in the community and he was not interested in The Rotary Foundation.

He gave a history of The Rotary Foundation



with special emphasis on the End Polio Now initiative that started in 1986.

He talked about Edgar Allen who was a member of the International Association of Crippled Children. He urged Rotary founder Paul Harris to become chair of the organization, which later became known as Easter Seals. It was discovered many benefactors had polio.

Polio was eliminated in the United States, and District 7300 in Guatemala wanted to devise a program to eliminate the dreaded disease there. Eventually that was achieved.

Through work with the Center for Disease Control, the World Health Organization and the Bill Gates Foundation, the initiative spread worldwide. There are only two countries declared polio endemic, although there are signs it may be coming

back in some areas.

Part of the problem is some governments have told their people that young girls who receive the polio immunization drops will become sterile, although that is not true. It is hoped current efforts will continue to eliminate polio from the face of the world.

"What are we gonna do next?" Governor Simmer asked.

He talked about Rotary's six areas of focus: peace and conflict prevention/resolution; disease prevention and treatment; water and sanitation; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and economic and community development.

He noted 70,000 people in District 5495 do not have clean water.

In closing, he repeated a famous quote: "To whom much is given, much will be expected." He said the only mistake he made in his original thought about Rotary, was the definition of "community." Our "community" is world wide. We need to share what we have been given.
