"We need to allow new members to be immediately integrated into our club," Roger said.

Roger M. noted strong points of Rotary clubs (most of which we do): greeting visitors, having good programs, developing a strategy for attracting new members, have a stated retention plan, create a positive experience for all members and guests, and improve public image which can be done through a club's website.

The board approved to send three Basha High School students to the RYLA Pinerock Camp in April.


The board approved a \$3,100 anonymous donation project. More details will be coming.
