Chili Cook-Off

The second annual No More Chili Dippin' Chili Cook-Off was held January 10 on the patio at San Marcos Golf Course. The event was co-sponsored by San Marcos and the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club as a benefit for The First Tee program that is designed to introduce youngsters to golf and mentor them to become better.

More than 40 CHRC members, spouses, friends and guests enjoyed an evening of fellowship, music and chili cooked up by seven chefs, some of whom were also CHRC members. Everyone sampled the seven different chilis and voted on their favorite.

The top three chefs were CHRC members: Doug Gardner was declared the winner for his White Lightning Chili; Jean Dransfeldt (Bruce's wife) took second for her Mother's Original Chili (which was appropriately named); and Roger Morsch took third place for his Bliss Chili (also known as Green Chili Soup). The top three received a spoon and a medallion.

Other entrees were Chef Amanda's Swiss Italian Chili (last year's winner); Chef Kelly's Red Curry Chili; Chef Paul's Special Chili; and Chef Terry's Chili Chili Bang Bang
